Best Practices:

- Post signs and reminders. Label and color-code all containers clearly.
- Send conservation best practices and reminders to employees at least quarterly.
- Include conservation in employee performance expectations and on-boarding.
- Survey staff for their input and buy-in.
- Coordinate with custodians and janitors.
- Tenants: Work with your property manager.
- Property Managers: Include recycling and composting in your lease requirements.
- Decide between centralized vs. deskside recycling.
- Promote a "trash buddy" system.
- Set up a Green Team. (Ask us how!)
- Conduct a waste audit to measure progress.

- Indoor sorting signs in multiple languages

Reduce Waste – Rethink Practices

- Make reusable dishware available in break and kitchen areas.
- Hold waste-free meetings.
- Eliminate single-use packaging.
- Assess incoming/outgoing packaging for opportunities to reduce waste.
- Switch to electronic formats to go paperless and/or set copy machines to automatically make double-sided copies.
- Hold virtual meetings to reduce travel when possible.
- Encourage staff to use reusable water bottles, coffee mugs, and pack waste-free lunches.







Recycling and Safe Disposal for Unusual Items



Bellevue Utilities offers guidance on how to safely dispose of unusual items. Safe disposal options are available for items such as batteries, electronics, appliances, hazardous materials, furniture, latex paint, Styrofoam, plastic film, etc.


