ORDINANCE NO. 4049

AN ORDINANCE adopting a Code of Ethics for the City Council and City boards, commissions and committees; and adding a new Chapter 3.92 to the Bellevue City Code.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. A new Chapter 3.92 is hereby added to the Bellevue City Code, to be entitled "Code of Ethics - City Council and City Boards, Commissions and Committees," and to provide as follows:

Chapter 3.92 Code of Ethics - City Council and City Boards, Commissions and Committees

3.92.010 - Declaration of Policy and Purpose

It is the policy of the City Council that the Council and City boards, commissions and committees conduct City business in accordance with high ethical standards. It is the purpose of this chapter to establish standards of ethical behavior which will govern members of the City Council and members of all City boards, commissions and committees.

3.92.020 - Adoption of State Law By Reference

To the extent that they are by their terms applicable to public officers, public officials and municipal officers, RCW Chapters 42.22 and 42.23 are hereby adopted by this reference and made applicable to members of the City Council and the City's boards, commissions and committees.

3.92.030 - Penalties

Any violation of this ordinance by any member of the City Council or of any City board, commission or committee shall be punishable as provided in RCW 42.22 and 42.23, respectively.
