

CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON

ORDINANCE NO. 5323

AN ORDINANCE authorizing the City Manager to execute an agreement with the Washington State Criminal Justice Training Commission to provide staffing and accept funding for staffing; appropriating additional revenues for said services to the General Fund and increasing the General Fund appropriation for the 2001-2002 Budget; and amending the Operating Budget adopted pursuant to Ordinance No. 5266

WHEREAS, the Washington State Criminal Justice Training Commission (WSCJTC) operates the Basic Law Enforcement Academy that serves all Washington Police Agencies; and

WHEREAS, the Washington State Criminal Justice Training Commission (WSCJTC) has determined it needs additional staffing resources to address regional needs; and

WHEREAS, the WSCJTC has requested that the City of Bellevue provide this additional staffing and resources; and

WHEREAS, the WSCJTC has requested that the City of Bellevue temporarily assign and experienced police officer to serve as an instructor at the WSCJTC Academy; and

WHEREAS, the officer assigned to the WSCJTC will be on temporary assignment for a period of two years; and

WHEREAS, there are multiple benefits to the Bellevue Police Department in providing an officer to serve as an academy instructor; and

WHEREAS, the City of Bellevue desires to provide the WSCJTC with an experienced officer to serve as an academy instructor; and

WHEREAS, the WSCJTC has agreed to reimburse the City for 100% of the assigned officer's salary and benefits and other incidental expenses the City will continue to pay the officer while the officer is an academy instructor; and

WHEREAS, the revenue from the WSCJTC will allow the City to fund one police officer FTE position until such time as the agreement with the WSCJTC ends, keeping the department fully staffed with officers; and

WHEREAS, the Police Department agrees to relinquish one FTE police officer position at the time the agreement with the WSCJTC ends; and

WHEREAS, the City's Operating Budget did not include funding for these purposes; now, therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City Manager or his designee is authorized to execute an agreement with the WSCJTC to accept funding for reimbursement for the City continuing to pay the full

salary and benefits of the officer while he/she is an academy instructor. A copy of this agreement has been given Clerk's Receiving No. 31020.

Section 2. The appropriate administrative officials of the City are hereby authorized to receive monies and to expend the same as authorized in said agreements.

Section 3. The approximate amount and source of revenue for providing an officer to the WSCJTC is:

WSCJTC	\$ 68,031.00
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Section 4. Upon execution of said Agreement, the budget for the Police Department General Fund shall be amended by appropriating to that fund additional revenues in the amount of the additional funding and acceptance herein authorized.

Section 5. The General Fund appropriation for the 2001-2002 Operating Budget, adopted pursuant to Ordinance No. 5266, is summarized as follows:

Section 6. Section 2 of the Ordinance No. 5266, the 2001-2002 Budget Ordinance, is hereby amended by appropriating additional revenue to be received during the 2002 fiscal year to the General Fund in the amount specified in Section 5 of this ordinance. The source of said funds, which were not anticipated in the 2001-2002 General Fund budget, along with the purposes for which they are being appropriated are specified in the agreement referenced in section one of this ordinance.

Section 7. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after its passage and legal publication.
