

CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON

ORDINANCE NO. 5409

AN ORDINANCE extending Residential Permit Parking Zone 4 to establish "Two Hour Parking 8am - 5pm, Except Saturday, Sunday and Holidays, Except By Zone 4 Permit" on the west side of 108th Avenue NE from the north property line of 1233 108th Avenue NE, extended, to the south property line of 1221 108th Avenue NE, extended; and amending Ordinance No. 3960.

WHEREAS, on October 24, 1988, the City Council adopted Ordinance No. 3960, establishing a residential permit parking zone limiting parking to "Two Hour Parking 8am - 5pm, Except Saturday, Sunday and Holidays," except by permit on the 1200 block and 1300 block of 106th Place NE and on the 10600 block of NE 13th Street; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined the residential permit parking zone should be extended to a portion of the west side of 108th Avenue NE; now, therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 1 of Ordinance No. 3960 is amended to read as follows:

Parking of vehicles on the streets listed below shall be restricted to two-hour parking from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. except Saturday, Sunday and holidays, except by Zone 4 permit:

Both sides of 1200 block of 106th Place NE
Both sides of 1300 block of 106th Place NE
Both sides of 10600 block of NE 13th Street
West side of 108th Avenue NE from the north property line, extended, of 1233 108th Avenue NE to the south property line, extended, of 1221 108th Avenue NE.

Section 2. The parking restrictions established by this ordinance shall be filed with and maintained by the City Clerk in accordance with Bellevue City Code 11.23.010.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days after its passage.
