CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON

ORDINANCE NO. 5735

AN ORDINANCE authorizing the City Manager or his designee to execute a one-year agreement, with an option for renewal, to provide data center co-location services to the City of Seattle; and to amend the 2007-2008 Information Technology Fund Budget adopted pursuant to Ordinance No. 5711, as amended, to increase appropriations by \$249,600, or in the amount actually received from the City of Seattle for such services.

WHEREAS, Data centers house the core network equipment and servers that run the mission-critical applications needed to provide city services; and

WHEREAS, the new Bellevue City Hall has a modern, seismically-mitigated data center that is sufficiently sized to allow for future growth; and

WHEREAS, this growth includes equipment needed for the City's growing needs as well as equipment needed for regional initiatives; and

WHEREAS, the City is ready to provide data center co-location services to its regional partners; and

WHEREAS, a key need for several cities and school districts is to have adequate data center backup facilities in case their primary facility becomes inaccessible; and

WHEREAS, the City of Seattle has approached the City to provide a backup facility for Seattle's data; and

WHEREAS, the IT Department has analyzed the City's long-term space needs and determined that the City can provide data center co-location services to regional partners with minimal impact to operations; and

WHEREAS, the City of Seattle has agreed that Bellevue will not be held responsible for any damages that may be suffered by Seattle in connection with Seattle's use of such co-location services; and

WHEREAS, the revenue generated from the service will cover the increased power and cooling demand, infrastructure changes to accommodate customers, and IT staff time needed for customer support, and;

WHEREAS, the revenue will also allow the City to offset future investments needed to keep up with the City's own growing needs; and

WHEREAS, no additional City funding is necessary to provide this service;
and

WHEREAS, the City's Operating Budget did not anticipate revenue for these
purposes; now, therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON, DOES
ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:


Section 1. The City Manager or his designee is hereby authorized to execute
a one-year agreement, with an option for renewal, to provide data center co-location
services to the City of Seattle. A copy of this agreement has been given Clerk's
Receiving No. 41439

Section 2. The City Manager or his designee is hereby authorized to amend
the 2007-2008 Information Technology Fund Budget, adopted pursuant to
Ordinance No. 5711, as amended, to increase appropriations by \$249,600, or in the
amount actually received from the City of Seattle for such services.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after
its passage by the City Council.




