ORDINANCE NO. 5816

AN ORDINANCE amending section 23.11 of the Bellevue City Code, local amendments to the International Fire Code by adding a new section 23.11.105.1.1.1 in order to re-establish fire code permit fees inadvertently omitted with the adoption of the 2006 International Fire Code in Ordinance No. 5749.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS, RCW 19.27.031 expressly requires the City of Bellevue to adopt state building, residential, mechanical, fire, plumbing and related uniform codes; and

WHEREAS, RCW 19.27.060 provides the City with authority to amend the codes enumerated in RCW 19.27.031 as they apply within the City's corporate boundaries, provided such modifications do not result in less than the minimum performance standards and objectives contained in the state uniform codes; and

WHEREAS, the City Council lawfully adopted Ordinance 5749 on June 25, 2007, repealing Chapter 23.11 and enacting a new Chapter 23.11, adopting provisions of the 2006 International Fire Code as adopted by the Washington State Building Code Council in Chapter 51-54 WAC; and

WHEREAS, the provision for fire permit fees was inadvertently omitted; now, therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. A new section 23.11.105.1.1.1 of the Bellevue City Code is hereby adopted as follows:

23.105 International Fire Code Section 105.1.1.1 – Permit fees.

105.1.1.1 Permit Fees. A fee of fifty dollars (\$50.00) shall be charged annually for each type of operational permit (as defined in International Fire Code Section 105.6).

Exceptions:

1. Any hazardous material with multiple classifications shall be charged only once.

2. No fees shall be charged for candles in a place of assembly or parade floats.
3. Fees shall be waived for government agencies and non-profit organizations.
4. A fee of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) shall be charged for pyrotechnical special effects permits.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after passage by the City Council.
