ORDINANCE NO. 5888

AN ORDINANCE 1) authorizing execution of a grant agreement (and supplements if necessary) with King County Metro (KCM) to accept \$85,000 in federal Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality funding and \$135,000 in State I-405 Construction Mitigation funding for a Phase III Downtown Bellevue Transportation Demand Management (TDM) Market Enhancement Project; 2) authorizing execution of an agreement with the Bellevue Downtown Association (BDA) for implementation services, in an amount not to exceed \$213,250, in support of the one-year Phase III Downtown Bellevue TDM Market Enhancement Project; 3) amending the 2009-2010 General CIP fund to increase the appropriation by \$175,000; and, amending the 2009-2015 General CIP Plan by increasing the project budget for Transportation Demand Management (PW-R-87) by \$175,000 in contributions from King County.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City Manager or his designee is authorized to execute a grant agreement (and supplements if necessary) with King County Metro (KCM) to accept \$85,000 in federal Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality funding and \$135,000 in State I-405 Construction Mitigation funding for a Phase III Downtown Bellevue Transportation Demand Management (TDM) Market Enhancement Project, which grant agreement shall be substantially in the form given Clerk's Receiving No. 44886.

Section 2. The City Manager or his designee is hereby authorized to execute an agreement with the Bellevue Downtown Association (BDA) for implementation services in the amount of \$213,250 in support of the one-year Phase III Downtown Bellevue TDM Market Enhancement Project; a copy of which agreement has been given Clerk's Receiving No. 44753.

Section 3. The City Manager or his designee is hereby further authorized to execute all documents necessary to fulfill the terms of the agreements authorized in Section 1 and 2.

Section 4. The City Manager or his designee shall have the responsibility for the administration and expenditure of said grant monies and monies received pursuant to said Agreement and shall have all authority necessary to enter into agreements regarding the use thereof.

Section 5. The 2009-2010 General Capital Investment Program (CIP) Fund appropriation adopted by Ordinance No. 5851 on December 1, 2008 as previously amended is hereby further amended to increase the appropriation to said CIP fund by \$175,000.


Section 6. The City's 2009-2015 General Capital Investment Program Plan adopted by Ordinance No. 5851 on December 1, 2008 as previously amended is hereby further amended by increasing the project budget (CIP Plan No. PW-R-87, Transportation Demand Management) by \$175,000.

Section 7. If the actual revenue received from the anticipated sources specified in said grant agreement shall be more or less than the anticipated amount set forth herein, the appropriations to the CIP Fund and Plan shall be adjusted to be equal to the amount actually received.

Section 8. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after passage and legal publication.




