ORDINANCE NO. 5901

AN ORDINANCE authorizing execution of a grant agreement (and supplements if necessary) with the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) to accept up to \$192,500 in State Safe Routes to School funding; amendment of the 2009-2010 General CIP fund to increase the appropriation by \$192,500 in grant funds; and amendment of the 2009-2015 Capital Investment Program (CIP) Plan to increase the project budget for the 152nd Avenue SE and SE 45th Street/SE 46th Street to Newport Way (CIP Plan No. PW-W/B-74) by \$192,500.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City Manager or his designee is authorized to execute a grant agreement (and supplements if necessary) with the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) to accept up to \$192,500 in State Safe Routes to School funding, a copy of which grant agreement has been given Clerk's Receiving No. 48223.

Section 2. The City's 2009-2010 General CIP fund appropriation adopted by Ordinance 5851 on December 1, 2008, as previously amended, is hereby further amended to increase the appropriation to said CIP by \$192,500.

Section 3. The City's 2009-2015 Capital Investment Program (CIP) Plan adopted by Ordinance 5851 on December 1, 2008, as previously amended, is hereby further amended by increasing the project budget for the 152nd Avenue SE and SE 45th Street/SE 46th Street to Newport Way (CIP Plan No. PW-W/B-74) by \$192,500 reflecting the State Safe Routes to School funding.

Section 4. The City Manager or his designee shall have responsibility for the administration of said grant monies and shall have all authority necessary to enter into agreements regarding the use thereof.

Section 5. The appropriate administrative officials of the City are hereby authorized to receive monies and to expend the same as authorized in said agreement.

Section 6. The approximate amount and anticipated source of revenue for the grant proposal and acceptance is:



Provided, however, if the actual revenue received from the source specified in said Interagency Agreement should be more or less than the amount set forth herein, the appropriation shall be adjusted to be equal to the amount actually received.

Section 7. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after passage and legal publication.


