

Four alternatives have been analyzed in the draft environmental impact statement. The land use and transportation components contained in these alternatives represent different visions about the future of the Bel-Red corridor. Please attend this community meeting if you would like to comment on the components you would like to see in the Preliminary Preferred Alternative. Refreshments will be provided.

Your comments will be reported to the project steering committee. Committee members will consider them as they develop a preliminary preferred alternative. The committee will make a recommendation to City Council later this year. The preferred vision will be evaluated in a final environmental impact statement.

**Project Summary:** *The Bel-Red Corridor Project is developing an updated land use and transportation vision for a 912-acre area in central Bellevue. This is the most comprehensive review ever undertaken of this light industrial and commercial district, much of which was first developed four decades ago. Part of the update vision will capitalize on the opportunities created by Sound Transit's potential routing of Light Rail through the corridor. The effort is overseen by a 15-member steering committee, appointed by the City Council to represent a broad range of community interests.*
