

CITY COUNCIL AGENDA MEMORANDUM

SUBJECT:

Resolution No. 8719 authorizing execution of an Interlocal Agreement with King County Road Services Division for on-call traffic and road maintenance services, for a maximum two-year term.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This agreement provides the City with the option to use King County Road Services for delivery of eligible services stipulated under the agreement. King County services have the potential to provide the City with lower costs and more efficient service delivery through economies of scale as compared to outside contracting. The agreement does not require that any specific volume of work be performed and is at the City's discretion to utilize these services. The services under the agreement support projects or programs already approved by Council in the 2013-2014 Operating and Capital Budgets. Funding for 2015 will be requested as part of the 2015-2016 Budget.

POLICY CONSIDERATION:

Comprehensive Plan

Council action is needed to execute the Interlocal Agreement with King County Road Services Division. The work that may be performed under this agreement is consistent with policy stated in the Transportation Element of the Comprehensive Plan, which states the importance of maintaining and enhancing safety for all users of the roadway network system (Policy TR-46).

BACKGROUND:

Pursuant to RCW 39.34, the Interlocal Cooperation Act, local governmental units are enabled to cooperate with other localities on a basis of mutual advantage. The City can achieve cost savings and benefits in the public's interest by contracting with King County for the performance of certain road related services such as bridge inspection and related repair, guardrail installation, and pavement patching to name a few.

Through this agreement, King County can provide services that the City does not have the capability of providing for itself, such as certified bridge inspection, that provide savings in economy of scale, such as inclusion of small guardrail projects in the County's annual guardrail installation construction contract, and that are above and beyond what City staff can perform in a timely manner, such as pavement patching for utilities, repair of pavement markings, or replacement of bulbs in street lights. In addition, efficiencies are realized through lower costs for work in comparison to outside contracts, and through a quicker turnaround in getting the work started.

EFFECTIVE DATE:

If approved, this Resolution becomes effective immediately upon Council adoption.

OPTIONS:

1. Adopt Resolution No. 8719 authorizing execution of an Interlocal Agreement with King County Road Services Division for on-call traffic and road maintenance services, for a maximum two-year term.
2. Do not adopt the Resolution and provide alternative direction to staff.
