Mercer Slough Nature Park Periphery Loop

Experience this remarkable 320-acre park on primarily hard surface trails and sidewalks, ideal for bikes and strollers. (4 miles)

Winters House (Open T & Th-Sat, 10am - 2pm) and Heritage Loop Trail

Stroll through history on this meandering level trail. Use the boardwalk to connect to Bellefield's Loop and Mercer Slough Env. Ed. Center. (1.1 miles)

Blueberry Farm

The historic Mercer Slough Blueberry Farm helps preserve Bellevue's agricultural heritage. Farmers Market, April - October
U-pick blueberries, July - August

Sweyolocken Boat Launch and Water Trail

Navigable by boat, the water trail is a fun and unique way to experience the park. Hundreds of plant and animal species can be seen along the slow moving slough. (2.6 miles)

Canoe the Mercer Slough

May - September. Enjoy Ranger led canoe trips. Departs from Enatai Beach Park. (425) 452-6885

Bellefields Loop Trail

Experience the beauty of forested wetlands and meadows as the trail loops through the park. (0.8 miles)

To Reach the Trailhead:

East side: Mercer Slough Environmental Education Center and Bellefields Trailhead
Directions: From I-405, take exit # 12, SE 8th Street, turn west. Turn left onto 118th Ave SE, heading south. Parking lot ~ 0.5 miles is on right.

West side: Winters House, Blueberry Farm and Sweyolocken Boat Launch
Directions: From I-90, take exit # 9, Bellevue Way exit. Parking is on right before 112th Avenue SE.
