- Pier brings people's boats too close to properties
- Lockers for leaving items if out kayaking
- Where will the sailing club and other boaters go? There is limited space.
- Where will temporary moorage go? Motorized. Worried about increased boat traffic.
- Look forward to the beach for grandkids who live near Meydenbauer
- Want a place to float on water with floatation devices
- High Pier Option/Low Pier Option: (equivalent numbers of people supporting each one)
- Least cost
- Would like benches on pier and railings
- Keep the lap swimming lanes
- (Show) Harbor lines on plan
- (Need) Lights on pier—navigation
- Bass fishermen like shade
- Canoe/kayak/SUP rentals—Phase 1
- Move "no wake" zone west, closer to edge of boom or whole bay
- Rental storage for PPVs
