

Another request noted on your Citizen Action Request Form was for a Brush Trim. Our recent field review revealed clear sight lines; however, please let us know if there are vegetation issues in the future.

Although physical traffic calming measures cannot be installed on 116th Avenue SE, there are a number of education programs, which are effective at heightening motorists' awareness of the speed limit. Borrowing a radar dolly, for example, would give you a better idea of traffic conditions on your street while also encouraging speeding motorists to slow down. We also encourage you and your neighbors to participate in the Neighborhood Speed Watch and Neighborhood Speed Reduction Programs described in this packet.

Police enforcement plays a key role in reducing vehicle speeds. We have forwarded a copy of the most recent 116th Avenue SE speed study to Police Traffic to assist them with their enforcement efforts. In addition, we have requested extra enforcement for you. We encourage you to contact them directly as well, by calling 425-577-5656 and requesting police enforcement.
