

About this book

This workbook is designed to be used with Pedbee's Karaoke Video and "What's Wrong" game. It is for children ages 5 to 12 years old, or Kindergarten through 5th grade. The activities in the video and workbook teach children about pedestrian and traffic safety.

Together you and your class are encouraged to work on the activities provided in this book. By doing so, you can help them gain a better understanding of pedestrian and traffic safety. With your help, we can all teach children how to be safe around traffic.

Each year more than 50,000 children are injured in pedestrian accidents and elementary school aged children are at the greatest risk. They may not have the skills to handle everyday traffic issues as they begin to play outdoors and walk to school without adult supervision.

The majority of child pedestrian injuries are a result of children crossing the street in an unsafe manner. Darting out into the streets is extremely hazardous. Taking the time to educate your students will help to ensure that they've been taught correct traffic safety lessons. We would also encourage you to ask your school principal for their "Recommended Walking Route Map," which can help you in showing children the recommended routes to school.


As a driver, you can also help children avoid accidents by being alert, obeying speed limits and traffic laws, and taking extra caution when you are driving in residential areas—especially near schools and playgrounds.

We hope STEP (Safe Trips Education Packet) provides children some basics of traffic safety and examples needed to be responsible around traffic.

We appreciate your cooperation in partnering with us and Pedbee, our traffic safety mascot, in helping children "Bee Safe."

About This Book

Hi, I'm Pedbee, your pedestrian safety mascot and I will be guiding you through this workbook. Here are a few of my favorite traffic safety words.



Pedestrian: A person traveling on foot.

Carpool: Riding in a car with two or more people.

Traffic Signal: The red, yellow, and green light that controls traffic at intersections.

Introducing Pedbee



Bee Alert

- before crossing the street, stop at the curb, or edge of the street
- always look left, right, and then left again
- continue looking until you have crossed the street
- watch out for cars backing up and turning
- make sure drivers see you; try to make eye contact before crossing


Bee Careful

- walk facing traffic if you aren't on a sidewalk
- obey signs and signals
- in rain or snow, allow extra time to cross the street
- don't run out between parked cars
- use extra caution when playing near the street—don't play in the street

Bee Seen

- wear bright colored clothing during the day
- at night, carry a flashlight or wear reflective material


Look at the following pictures of Jack crossing the street. Put them in 1-2-3-4 order.




When the walk signal appears, look left, right, and left again.



Stop at the edge of the street and push the silver button. Wait for the walk signal.




If the hand starts blinking, you will still have time to cross. But, if you **haven't started** to cross, wait for the next walk signal.




When clear, start walking-don't run. **Keep looking and listening** as you cross.


Pedbee's Pedestrian Signal Quiz

Wrong-too far back

- Always, always, always wear a bike safety helmet.
- Make sure your bike works well and doesn't need to be repaired.
- Wear bright colors during the day.
- Avoid riding in the dark.
- Wear reflective clothing and make sure your bike has reflectors and a headlight if you must ride in the dark.
- Know and follow the rules of the road.




- Know your hand signals.


