

2010 Census release schedule


- **Feb/March 2011:** Redistricting data at the block level
 - Population counts by race and Hispanic or Latino categories
 - Housing counts by occupancy status
- ➔ ■ **May 2011:** Demographic Profile data at the place level
 - Selected population and housing characteristics (i.e. age, tenure, household type)
- **June-August 2011:** Summary File 1 data at the block and tract levels
 - Population counts for 63 race categories and Hispanic or Latino
 - Selected population and housing characteristics (i.e. age, tenure, household type)
- **December 2011 – April 2012:** Summary File 2 data at the tract level
 - Population and housing characteristics iterated for many detailed race and Hispanic or Latino categories, and American Indian and Alaska Native tribes










Important Things to Know about the American Community Survey

- The American Community Survey (ACS) produces *estimates* versus *counts* that may have large margins of error due to small sample sizes → therefore look at the margins of error before interpreting differences or trends.
- ACS estimates in this presentation are for the period January 1, 2005 – December 31, 2009. These differ from the snapshot or point in time counts provided by the 2010 Census for April 1, 2010.
- ACS estimates are not always directly comparable to the 2000 Census. See guidance for comparing at link below:


Age distribution

Age Distribution Downtown versus the City as a whole




Foreign born and world region of birth

World Region of Birth of Downtown's foreign born




34% of downtown residents speak a language other than English at home versus 33% in Bellevue as a whole



Downtown Distribution of Household Types




Average household size in downtown is 1.4 versus 2.4 in Bellevue as a whole

Educational Attainment of Downtown's 25 year and older population



Occupation Distribution of employed residents of Downtown


Occupation Distribution Downtown versus the City as a whole





Downtown Households**




**Downtown's median household income was \$65,500 versus \$80,350 in Bellevue as a whole
About 9.0% of people in downtown were in poverty versus 6.6% in Bellevue as a whole**


