



WHAT GOES WHERE?

Reduce contamination and make recycling count. Know what can be recycled, what is garbage, and what needs special handling. Check the back of this poster for resources and information on where to take Household Hazardous Waste and unwanted items.

Put These Items in the Blue Recycling Container.

Do not put items in bags except shredded paper and other plastic bags. NO lids or caps less than 3 inches in size. NO containers that held toxics. NO items listed in the Garbage section of this poster.



Mail, envelopes (windows, staples ok), catalogs. If you can tear it, it is recyclable.
NO plastic wrap or plastic-coated cards.



Paper, newspaper and inserts, folders, receipts, paper and tissue gift wrap.
NO foil gift wrap or ribbon.



Magazines, paperback books, phone books.
NO plastic wrappers.



Paper egg cartons, drink boxes, ice cream cartons, paper containers. Empty and rinse.
NO straws.



Paper food boxes. Remove liners and flatten.
NO soap residue, plastic handles or metal spouts.



Juice and milk cartons. Empty and rinse.



Cardboard. Flatten. Size limit: 3'x 3' or smaller when flattened.



NEW!
 Clean paper and plastic cups. Remove lids. Empty and rinse.
NO straws.



NEW!
 Lids 3 inches or larger. Remove from containers and rinse.



NEW!
 Plastic plant pots. Empty and rinse.



NEW!
 All plastic containers. Empty and rinse. Remove lids.
NO containers that held toxics, like pesticides or motor oil. NO plastic packaging.



Clear and colored glass bottles and jars. Empty and rinse. Remove lids. Labels ok.
NO drinking glasses, dishes, ceramics or window glass.



Plastic grocery bags and bubble wrap. Stuff into one plastic bag and tie securely.
NO single bags, receipts, food residue or food wrap.



Shredded paper. Put in a clear or see-through plastic bag. Tie a secure knot.
NO loose shredded paper.



Plastic 5-gallon buckets. Empty and rinse. Remove lids.
NO metal handles.



Aluminum and tin cans, clean foil and pie pans. Empty and rinse. Labels ok.



Scrap metals. Size limit: 2' in any direction, less than 35lbs.
NO greasy metal, wood, rubber or plastic.



Put These Items in the Grey Garbage Container.

Please bag loose items. NO TVs, computer equipment, cell phones (see Household Recycling on back). NO button batteries, fluorescent lights, thermometers or thermostats with mercury, wet paint, or other hazardous waste. NO yard debris or liquids.



Lids, caps and tops less than 3 inches wide. (Small lids get stuck in recycling machinery.)



Food scraps, paper plates and towels, napkins, tissues.



Styrofoam peanuts. Put in bag, reuse or take to a mailing store.



Styrofoam packaging, cups, clam shells, meat trays, egg cartons and other shapes.*



Dry out latex paint with kitty litter or hardener. Leave lid off.



Plastic packaging, magazine wrappers, food bags, foil pouches and bags, waxed paper.



Plastic garbage bags, zip-type bags.



Toiletry tubes, makeup, mirrors.



Ribbon, foil and clear gift wrap, bags with rope handles.



Empty containers that held toxic products, like pesticides and motor oil, empty aerosol cans.



Prescription vials, household batteries,* CDs, hangers* (many dry cleaners take hangers back), light bulbs (put in bag). **NO fluorescent bulbs or tubes.**



Cat litter or pet waste. Put in bag and tie shut.



Cigarette butts and ashes. Put in bag and tie shut.



Diapers. Put in bag and tie shut.



Glassware, ceramic plates and cups, plastic plates and utensils.

*Some of these items may be accepted at Bellevue's Special Collection Events. See back of poster.

Household Recycling by Special Arrangement

Your Property Manager can call Allied Waste and set up a special pickup for these items.

Once a pickup is scheduled, put small appliances, small electronics, and clothing and linens near (not in) your Blue Recycling Container. They'll go to a charity or will be recycled.

Small Electronics must be less than 2 feet in any direction and less than 60 lbs. Small electronics do not need to be bagged.

Cell phones
Computers/accessories/printers
Fax machines
Radios and stereos
TVs (screens 21" or less)

Small Appliances must be less than 2 feet in any direction and less than 35 lbs. Place in a securely closed plastic bag marked "Appliances."

Blenders
Coffee makers
Food processors
Hair dryers and curling irons
Microwaves, toasters
Irons



Clothing and Linens – Clothing, scarves, hats, belts, blankets and bedspreads, draperies, curtains, paired shoes (rubber band together), purses, backpacks, totes, wallets, stuffed animals.

Items must be clean, dry, non-moldy, and useable. No shoes with sharp heels, skates, slippers, or mattresses. Place in a securely closed plastic bag marked, "Clothing" near (not in) your Blue Recycling Cart.

Household Hazardous Waste

Take Household Hazardous Waste such as antifreeze, fluorescent bulbs and tubes, garden chemicals, mercury-containing products (thermometers, button batteries, etc.), oil-based paint, propane tanks, etc. to:

Large, Bulky Items

For large, bulky items such as mattresses and appliances, check King County's database at www.kingcounty.gov/whatdoiwit or call the City of Bellevue Utilities at 425-452-6932 (also see Special Collection Events). You can also take some items to King County's Factoria Transfer Station or King County's Houghton Transfer Station (see Resources).

Special Collection Events

The City of Bellevue holds two Special Collection Events a year – usually in the spring and fall - that take large appliances and other items (some fees apply). Watch for fliers in the mail or call the City of Bellevue Utilities at 425-452-6932 for details.

Medical Needles or "Sharps"

Medical needles or sharps can be put in the garbage, if prepared properly. Put in a rigid, puncture-proof container less than 1 gallon in size. Empty 2-liter pop bottles or 1-gallon milk jugs are acceptable when capped, taped, and labeled "Do Not Recycle." Call Allied for more information. Make Recycling Count. Please Remember to...

- Remove lids from recyclable containers. Recycle lids 3 inches or larger. Throw smaller size lids into the garbage.
- Flatten cardboard to make room for other recyclables.
- Put materials in the Blue Recycling Container loose. Do not bag.
- Make sure recyclable containers are clean and empty.
