We are at an important stage in the Bel-Red Corridor Project: the development of the preliminary preferred alternative. To help identify the best land use and transportation components to include in the alternative, we are inviting you to participate in one of two panels on March 14: a **panel of business owners** and a **panel of property owners**.

Purpose: To ensure that business and property owners have plenty of opportunity to **inject your thoughts and ideas into the process**. The results from the two panels input will be reported to the project steering committee for the development of the preliminary preferred alternative. Your input now is valuable!

We are also asking that you commit to attend the entire panel, or as much as you can. Project Summary: The Bel-Red Corridor Project is developing an updated land use and transportation vision for a 912-acre area in central Bellevue. This is the most comprehensive review ever undertaken of this light industrial and commercial district, much of which was first developed four decades ago. Part of the update vision will capitalize on the opportunities created by Sound Transit's potential routing of Light Rail through the Corridor. The effort is overseen by a 16-member steering committee, appointed by the City Council to represent a broad range of community interests.
