First Amendment to Interlocal Agreement between King County Sheriff's Office and the City of Bellevue Relating to Marine Patrol Services

The parties to the Interlocal Agreement between King County Sheriff's Office and the City of Bellevue Relating to Marine Patrol Services (Agreement) hereby amend said Agreement as follows:

- 4.1 Routine Marine Patrol Services. The City shall pay the County a share of the costs of marine patrol services allocated based on the city's portion of the overall County calls for services and on-view incidents and freshwater shoreline feet, as shown in Exhibit A to this Amendment (Exhibit A). The costs shall include direct costs, Sheriff's Office and County general overhead, less revenue received by the County for its share of the Vessel Registration Fee. Exhibit A reports adopted County budgeted costs and City charges for 2006. Both calls for service and cost shall be updated each calendar year. The calls for service for each year shall be those from the previous year's boating season. Cost will be based on the County's adopted budget for marine patrol services and estimated boat tax revenue, for the succeeding year.
- 4.2 The estimated contract amount for 2006 is \$59,774 as shown in Exhibit A. The County agrees to revise this amount annually following the King County Council's adoption of the Annual County budget. The County will provide the City by April 15 of the year for which the budget has been adopted a revised estimated agreement amount, if it is less than the amount shown in Exhibit A.
- 4.3 For 2006 the County shall bill the City monthly for non-routine services (as described in Section 1.4) at the rate of approximately \$66 per hour officer plus the hourly cost of the boat, starting at the time of call-out marine patrol officers for a minimum call-out of two hours. Actual hourly rates, based on the adopted budget, shall be provided to the city by May 15 of each year. Should the services affect more than one jurisdiction, the County shall negotiate the allocation of the costs with the City and other affected jurisdictions.
- 4.4 The estimate contract amount shall be billed as an annual amount in June, 2006. Payment shall be made within 30 days after invoicing by the County.

Said Amendment shall be effective May 1, 2006. All other provisions of the Agreement remain unchanged.

**CITY COUNCIL AGENDA MEMORANDUM**

**Subject:** Resolution No. 7344 authorizing execution of the first amendment to the existing interlocal agreement for Marine Patrol Services with the King County Sheriff's Office (KCSO), and approval of subsequent annual renewals, where the terms remain the same as in the current interlocal, and the cost does not increase by more than 5% annually.

**Fiscal Impact:** The KCSO's Marine Patrol unit agrees to provide routine marine patrol on Lake Sammamish and Lake Washington during calendar year 2006 (primarily during the annual boating season between May 14 and September 16) for the purpose of enforcing applicable laws and ordinances, promoting boating safety, and preventing law or safety violations. In return, the City agrees to pay a maximum of \$59,774 to KCSO upon approval of the amendment. For non-routine patrol services, the contract stipulates that the City will be billed monthly at the rate of approximately \$66 per hour per officer plus the hourly cost of the boat, with a minimum call-out of two hours. In the past four years, there have been no non-routine call-outs charged to the City.

The Police Department Budget includes \$56,265 in 2006 for marine patrol services. The remaining expense will be paid from reductions in other Police Department M&O line items. There are no funds budgeted in the adopted 2005-2006 budget for non-routine marine patrol services. If these calls do occur, additional reductions in other Police M&O line items will be required.

**POLICY CONSIDERATION**

Should the City execute a one-year amendment to the interlocal agreement with the King County Sheriff's Office Marine Patrol unit for the provision of marine patrol services along Bellevue's shorelines, and approve subsequent annual renewals where the cost does not exceed a 5% annual increase?

**BACKGROUND**

On May 25, 2000, the Bellevue City Council approved Resolution No. 6416, authorizing the City Manager to enter into a five-year agreement with KCSO to provide marine patrol services along the Bellevue shorelines in Lake Sammamish and Lake Washington. On January 18, 2005, the

Council approved Resolution No. 7131, authorizing the City to enter into a one-year agreement with automatic renewals from year to year. Bellevue has been pleased with the service provided during the past six years. The current amendment to the interlocal agreement will continue marine patrol services for an additional year.

The main service emphasis will be during the annual boating season from approximately May 14 through September 16. Shifts will emphasize the afternoon and early evening hours. The service will include routine patrol, setting and maintaining buoys, enforcing applicable laws and ordinances, promoting boating safety, and preventing law or safety violations. At the specific request of the City, the marine patrol unit will provide patrol services and/or respond to emergencies at times other than those of the daily boating season and outside the boating season. Payment for these services will be charged at approximately \$66 per hour, plus direct costs.

Seven cities contract with KCSO for marine patrol services on either Lake Washington or Lake Sammamish. Each city's charge for these services is based upon a combination of total boating incidents during the previous boating season, and total feet fronting the city's boundaries. Bellevue has the greatest amount of shoreline feet (61,563 out of 217,637) and the second largest percentage of incidents during the 2005 boating season (638 out of a total of 3,705) among all of the jurisdictions fronting either of the two lakes. Therefore, Bellevue's share of the total KCSO expenses for Marine Patrol is close to 23%.

The County's adopted full year budget for marine patrol in 2006 is \$1,210,259, but only \$403,420 of that is budgeted for the boating season (May 14 through September 16). This amount is further reduced by the boat tax revenue received by King County (discussed below), which is estimated to be \$140,716. Therefore, \$262,704 of King County boating season expenses must be distributed among the seven cities that request Marine Patrol services. Bellevue's portion is \$59,774.

King County receives Boat Tax revenue from the state's collection of excise taxes that are distributed to the counties throughout Washington. The County's use of Boat Tax revenue is governed by Chapter 12.45 of the King County Code and state law, which states that the revenue can only be used for administration and enforcement of boating safety, search and rescue, and boating patrols—any other use is prohibited. Furthermore, the revenue can only be allocated toward cities with a state-certified boating safety program, and Bellevue's contracting for Marine Patrol with the KCSO meets that condition.

The KCSO provides the City with quarterly reports of marine patrol services rendered within City waters, including the number of calls for service (dispatched and on-view), number and type of citations and warnings issued, and safety checks made. During 2005's boating season, the Marine Patrol effected 14 "person" rescues, 5 boat rescues valued at \$25,000, conducted 250 boat inspections, issued 172 citations and verbal warnings, and removed 5 hazards.

#### **EFFECTIVE DATE**

If approved by the Council, this Resolution will be effective immediately.


