

CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON

ORDINANCE NO. 5211

AN ORDINANCE authorizing execution of an Agreement with King County to accept \$85,931 in City Optional Program grant funds to fund the Business Recycling Program and Special Recycling Collection Events; establishing a project within the Operating Grants and Donations Fund; amending the budget for the Operating Grants and Donations Fund and the Solid Waste Fund by appropriating additional revenues to those funds; authorizing expenditures of said grant funds; and authorizing interfund loans.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City Manager or her designee is authorized to execute that certain Agreement between King County and the City of Bellevue to accept \$85,931 in City Optional Program (COP) grant funds in order to fund the Business Recycling Program and Special Recycling Events, a copy of which Interlocal Agreement has been given Clerk's Receiving No. 28497.

Section 2. The appropriate administrative officials of the City are hereby authorized to receive monies and to expend the same as authorized in said Interlocal Agreement.

Section 3. At the time of execution of said Agreement and acceptance of said funds, a project shall be established within the Operating Grants and Donations Fund into which all said monies shall be deposited.

Section 4. The City Manager or her designated representative shall have responsibility for the administration of said grant monies and shall have all authority necessary to enter into agreements regarding the use thereof.

Section 5. The approximate amount and source of revenue for the grant proposal and acceptance are:

Section 6. Upon execution of said Agreement, the budget for the Operating Grants and Donations Fund and the budget for the Solid Waste Fund shall be amended by appropriating to those funds additional revenues in the amount of the grant proposal and acceptance herein authorized.

Provided, however, if the actual revenue received from the source specified in said grant agreement should be more or less than the amount set forth herein, the appropriations shall be adjusted to equal the amount actually received.

Section 7. The Finance Director or his designee is authorized to make interfund loans from an appropriate City fund to the Operating Grants and Donations Fund in whatever amounts, for whatever duration or under whatever terms are appropriate and necessary to cover cash flow shortages in the Operating Grants and Donations Fund that may be created by this grant.

Section 8. The Finance Director or his designee is additionally authorized to make interfund loans from an appropriate City Fund to the Solid Waste Fund in whatever amounts, for whatever duration or under whatever terms are appropriate and necessary to cover cash flow shortages in the Solid Waste Fund that may result from making necessary program expenditures associated with this grant.

Section 9. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force five days after its passage and legal publication.
