

# POTENTIAL BALLOT MEASURE OVERVIEW

Since 2014, the Bellevue City Council has been discussing the city's ability to fund the long list of capital projects needed to serve the entire community. Despite current initiatives to prioritize and strengthen Bellevue's infrastructure, forecast data shows a significant funding gap. The Bellevue City Council is presently considering two measures that could appear on the November 2016 ballot. These measures would fund important neighborhood transportation and fire facility projects.



## Upgrade Fire Facilities **\$120M over 20 years**

Improve emergency response capabilities by:

- Improving all existing fire stations to ensure that they can withstand a major earthquake
- Provide support to build a new fire station downtown, Bellevue's fastest-growing neighborhood
- Upgrade stations to accommodate emergency equipment and modern fire trucks
- Replace aging mechanical and building systems

## Enhance Neighborhood Safety & Connectivity **\$120M over 20 years**

Reduce the backlog and enhance safety by focusing on addressing these areas:

- Neighborhood safety - traffic calming and crosswalks
- New sidewalks and trails
- New bike facilities
- Sidewalk and trail maintenance enhancements
- Enhanced technology for safety and traffic management
- Neighborhood congestion
