

**Fish Use:** All salmon use the nearshore area of Lake Washington at some stage of their life history. Sockeye salmon are known to spawn at Enatai, Chesterfield, and Chism Beach Parks. They likely spawn at any location along the shoreline that has gravel substrate and upwelling water conditions. Juvenile chinook rear along the shoreline from January through June, with the most abundance occurring between March and mid-May. The chinook juveniles are typically found in less than two feet water depth and seem to prefer sand and gravel substrates. Both juvenile and adult chinook appear to actively select holding areas near tributary mouths or other freshwater sources.
