

APPENDIX B POPULATION BY CENSUS TRACT

This appendix contains a table showing 1990 and 2000 population figures for each 1990 census tract wholly *or partly* in Bellevue. As discussed in the introduction, tracking change between 1990 and 2000 requires use of 1990 tracts to maintain a constant geographic base.¹ With the geographic base held constant, the data mapped reflect changes in population without respect to an area's annexation status. A map showing census tract boundaries for 1990 is provided in the previous appendix.
