1. **CALL TO ORDER:**

The meeting was called to order by Chair Robinson at 6:11 p.m.

2. **APPROVAL OF AGENDA:**

**Motion by Boardmember Evans and second by Vice-Chair Grindeland to approve the meeting agenda as presented.**

Mr. Ogliore and Ms. Clayton invited Boardmembers to the annual Symetra Bellevue Family 4<sup>th</sup> Celebration at Bellevue Downtown Park. Attendees can enjoy a family fun zone, international food court, live music, and a spectacular fireworks show. Fireworks will be synchronized to a live performance by the Bellevue Youth Symphony Orchestra.

Last year, the Symetra Bellevue Family 4<sup>th</sup> Celebration was named *American Profile Magazine's* "Top 10 Firework Displays in America."

Boardmember Evans made the following report:

Boardmember Van Hollebeke made the following report:

- Observed the Bellevue High School prom picture event at Downtown Park.
- Spoke with the President of the Old Bellevue Merchant's Association about ways the Association is advocating for a more friendly, inviting atmosphere in Old Bellevue during the 4<sup>th</sup> of July celebration.
- Congrats to the Parks Department for the ongoing positive letters regarding park maintenance throughout the city.

## 8. **DIRECTOR'S REPORT:**

Mr. Foran informed Boardmembers that former Park Boardmember Merle Keeney's wife, Julie Anne Keeney, recently passed away. Memorial services will be held on June 22 at the South Bellevue Community Center.

The Community Leadership Awards Ceremony was held on May 29 to honor Bellevue youth. Mr. Foran noted that the event was inspiring.

The City recently conducted a community outreach session for Cultural Diversity. There were approximately 150 people in attendance at the event. The information gathered will assist in updating the City's Diversity Plan.

## 9. **DISCUSSION/ACTION ITEMS:**

### A. **Grant for Hidden Valley**

Mr. Foran explained that the Boys & Girls Club would like to apply for a \$75,000 Youth Sports Facility Grant (YSFG) from King County for the Hidden Valley project. The City, as property owner, must co-sponsor the application. Mr. Foran noted that this funding source has been used for previous projects, such as the Crossroads Water Play Area and Highland Skate Park. Boardmembers reviewed a letter of support for this project.

**Motion by Boardmember Van Hollebeke and second by Boardmember Powell to approve the Boys & Girls Club application co-sponsorship and letter of support for the Youth Sports Facility Grant (YSFG) from King County for the Hidden Valley project. Motion carried unanimously (6-0).**

B. Board Elections

**Motion by Boardmember Powell to appoint Boardmember Evans as Parks & Community Services Board Vice-Chair.**

**Motion by Chair Robinson to appoint Boardmember George as Parks & Community Services Board Vice-Chair.**

Chair Robinson requested other nominations for the Parks & Community Services Board Vice-Chair position. There were none. Therefore, nominations were closed.

**At the question, motion carried (4-2) to elect Boardmember Evans as the Parks & Community Services Board Vice-Chair.**

C. Bellevue's Aging Population

*6:43-7:03 p.m. Boardmembers toured the North Bellevue Community Center*

Ms. VonWald provided a presentation on the demographic/census for older adults, City of Bellevue and Parks & Community Services role in serving older adults and an update on the Network on Aging. In particular, the following items were discussed:

Boardmember Evans questioned if there is a correlation between the services that are offered in Bellevue and the population of older adults. Ms. VonWald thinks that there is a direct correlation.

Ms. VonWald explained that there was a Senior Services Review project conducted in 2004 to identify ways to better meet the needs of current and future older adults in Bellevue. A copy of this study was distributed to Boardmembers. Ms. VonWald reported that a review of this study's findings will commence later in 2013.

Ms. VonWald reported that the Bellevue Network on Aging has been praised in various national documents for their ability to get aging residents involved in the community. She will forward this information to Boardmembers.

Vice-Chair Grindeland asked what the City is doing to assist with various language barriers. Ms. VonWald explained that there are partner agencies that assist with language issues. In addition, there is a language phone line that offers services to translate many different languages.

Boardmember Evans inquired if the North Bellevue Community Center represents the largest percentage of diversity within the community. Mr. Smith explained that all of the community centers have a diverse demographic representation, particularly Crossroads and South Bellevue.

10. **BOARDMEMBER COMMITTEE/LIAISON REPORTS:**

A. Network on Aging

Chair Robinson reported that the Bellevue Network on Aging recently participated in the Eastside Housing Forum, which is working to end homelessness on the Eastside.

B. Bridle Trails Neighborhood Park Update

Boardmember Heath explained that community members are being solicited for their feedback to finalize a name for the park being developed in the Bridle Trails Neighborhood. Construction of the park is expected to begin in the fall.

C. Transit Master Plan

Boardmember Evans reported that the Transit Master Plan was presented to City Council on May 20, 2013. There are currently no fiscal impacts on future budgets.

D. Downtown Livability Study

Boardmember Powell participated in a Downtown Livability Advisory Committee tour. During a recent committee meeting, committee members discussed incentives to create public open space on privately owned land. Mr. Foran noted that the Downtown Livability Committee will help create some of the zoning rules and guidelines for the Downtown corridor. Boardmembers discussed various scenarios and incentives to encourage developers to include open spaces.
