The Neighborhood Safety and Connectivity measure is focused on transportation and would fund construction of neighborhood sidewalks, paths, and safe routes to school throughout the City to improve pedestrian and bicyclist safety, and connect more neighborhoods to each other, to parks, and to schools. This measure would increase regular property taxes, allowing collection of up to \$5.5 million in additional taxes per year over 20 years. The 2017 tax limit would be 12.5 cents per \$1,000 dollars of assessed value. This measure would cost the owner of a \$640,000 home, the average home value in Bellevue, about \$80 per year. Knowing this, would you strongly support, somewhat support, somewhat oppose, or strongly oppose this measure?
