### Bellevue Youth Camp

The Bellevue Police Department is thrilled to report the success of its inaugural police youth camp, aimed at fostering positive relationships between law enforcement and our community's youth. Held at the Bellevue public safety training center last week, this 3-day event involved 31 participants aged 11 to 14. It provided hands-on experience in policing, featuring activities such as fingerprint analysis, evidence collection, courtroom testimony, de-escalation training, community engagement, and first aid.



One standout aspect was the genuine interactions between police officers and campers, with officers serving as mentors, fostering trust, breaking misconceptions, and forming meaningful bonds. The youth participants gained valuable insights into the multifaceted nature of law enforcement and its essential role in maintaining a safe community. This achievement was possible through collaboration with the Bellevue Police Foundation, Bellevue Fire Department, and Bellevue Police Volunteers.

### Prevent vehicle thefts

A few steps you can take to help reduce the risk of your vehicle being stolen.



- **Lock Your Doors:** Always lock your vehicle's doors and windows, even if you are just running a quick errand.
- **Install an alarm system:** An alarm system with visible warning stickers may deter criminals and alert others.
- **Park in well-lit areas:** When parking your vehicle, choose well-lit and populated areas.
- **Don't leave your vehicle running:** Never leave your vehicle running while it is unoccupied, even if you are just running in to top off your coffee, or letting your vehicle warm up. Criminals are just waiting for these opportunities to steal your vehicle.
- **Don't leave valuables in plain sight:** remove valuables, such as electronics, bags, and packages. Criminals are more likely to target a vehicle with visible items of value.
- **Get to know your neighbors:** Building good relationship with your neighbors can lead to a stronger sense of community. They can call 911 if they see something suspicious.
- **Limited supply of free steering wheel locks** for Kia and Hyundai owners, please contact your Sector Captain.

## New customer engagement system launched

The Bellevue Police Department has enabled a new, fully automated digital engagement tool designed to keep crime victims and 911 callers informed and up to date on the status of their cases. The SPIDR Tech system sends out text or email messages from the onset of an incident and keeps the victim informed throughout the case. When the case has concluded, the system sends a satisfaction survey so the department can learn and improve service.

Speaking about the launch of SPIDR Tech, Chief Wendell Shirley stated, "We are here to protect and serve, and we want to make sure our community is getting the best service possible. SPIDR Tech will ensure crime victims have the important information they need as their case progresses, and we receive valuable information to better evaluate our performance."


When someone calls 911, SPIDR Tech sends out an acknowledgment text or email with the incident number. If the officer is delayed, they'll get an update. If the case is assigned to a detective, the victim will receive customized messages with contact information and status updates. At the conclusion of the investigation, there will be a survey asking about their experience with the Bellevue Police Department.


## When drivers have to stop for school buses

School bus lights are flashing and stop bar is out


### 1 2-lane roadway: both directions stop




### 2 3+ lanes: stop if traveling same direction as bus
